First Annual NPS Experiential Learning Week!

From May 26th to 30th, students in Grades 7 and 8 will embark on the first ever NPS Experiential Learning Week. Experiential Learning Week (ELW) allows students to engage deeply with a particular industry or field of interest. These unique experiences support students in developing workplace skills and assist them in making informed decisions on future career pathways. Each of these experiences will involve interactions and experiences with industry professionals (on and off-campus) as well as independent investigation and project work. Student work and discovery throughout ELW will be on display for our culminating **Celebration** of Learning. Parents and community members will be invited to this celebration at 1:00pm on Friday, May 30th, 2025.

Students in grade 7 and 8 have been placed in **one** of 10 possible ELW options for the week. All students who completed the form were given one of their top 3 choices for the week. Given that students were placed based on preferences, we will **not** be accepting any requests for changes in ELW options, unless there are unique circumstances. Please also remember that students will have future years to continue exploring other ELW or career pathway opportunities.

In this email, families can expect to see details about the schedule for the week and specific information related to each unique experience. Register Now to Save on Transportation Fees

Rocky View Schools (RVS) has opened transportation registration for the 2025/26 school year through SchoolEngage. Parents/guardians are encouraged to register by June 30 to receive a \$40 discount or by Aug. 1 to ensure bus service for the first day of school.

In response to rising costs, transportation fees have increased for the coming school year. A list of fees is available on the <u>RVS website</u>. Families are encouraged to take advantage of the early registration discount to offset some of the transportation cost. Eligible families may also apply to have their transportation fees waived by completing a Transportation Fee Waiver.

The June 30 early registration discount of \$40 is extended to each of the first two Kindergarten – Grade 12 students in a family, with additional students receiving \$20 off if registering early. A minimum payment of 50 per cent is due at registration. Bus service may be cancelled up until Oct. 31 to receive a full refund for all fees paid.

Families are urged to register as soon as possible for transportation to ensure a smooth start to the fall. To guarantee service for the first day of school, registration must be received before Aug. 1. Students registered after this deadline may experience delays of two to three weeks before they can ride the bus. A step-by-step guide to registration, fee information and more is available on the <u>Transportation</u> <u>section</u> of the RVS website.

Literacy and Numeracy Reassessments for Grades 1-3

Some students in Grades Kindergarten-3 who have been receiving intervention support in literacy and/or numeracy will be reassessed on one or more <u>provincial assessments</u> in late May to early June.

Please note:

1. Not all students will be reassessed.

2. Final data will be returned to RVS in August; your child's next-year teacher will have access to the information to make informed decisions about intervention supports needed.

Thank you for your understanding and support in our ongoing commitment to support student learning. If you are unsure if your child is being reassessed please reach out to their teacher.


Save-On Foods Receipts
